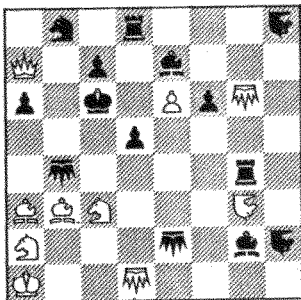


## "harmonie"-Informalturnier 1990

I thank Torsten Linß for asking me to judge this tourney. "harmonie" is a great little magazine, always full of interesting problems and articles.

There were 13 problems to judge (Nr. 22 being cooked without being corrected in time). The overall standard was good.

### 1. Preis: 32 - Hans Peter Rehm

A complex 3-mover! Two of TRD's favourite ideas are combined here: Triple Grimshaw and "Three Rider Double" (mutual interference on 3 squares by R, B, N). The Three Rider Double is realised as Nowotnys on d4/e4/f3 in reply to the Triple Grimshaw on d6. The construction is clear, though the need for a Wba3 is unfortunate.

**2. Preis: 12v - Peter Gvozdjak & Torsten Linß**

A "short-cut" Lachy (the threat being one of the thematic white moves). This r#2 uses a mechanism already known in the orthodox #3. There is an additional change after 1.- b3 and the r# specific refutation is excellent.

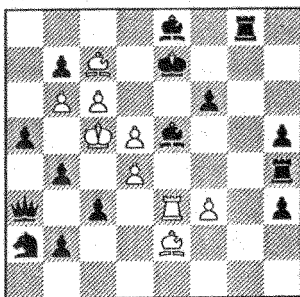

Le Grand theme + Siers-Rössel, combined with fine Circe effects.

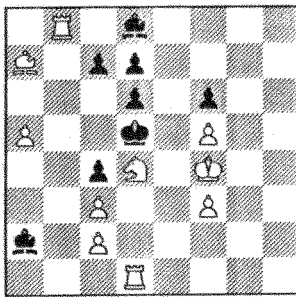

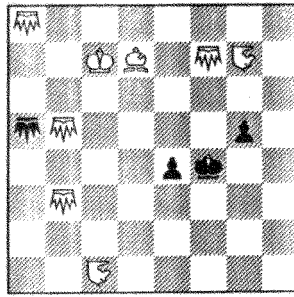

Dombrowskis + Critical/Anticritical tries has been shown in the orthodox #2. But here the composer has added anti battery wB/wN Grimshaw mates on f5. 2 more tries add the Hannelius theme as well. An attractiv meredith with all pieces well used.

An interesting task: cyclic platzwechsel of 12 white pieces.

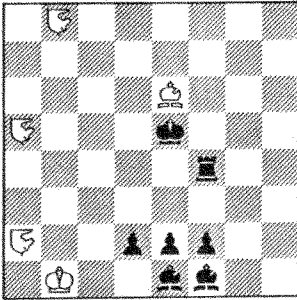

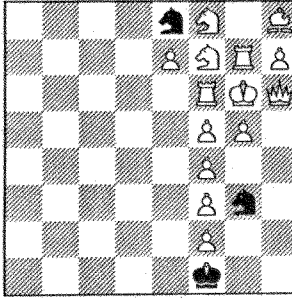

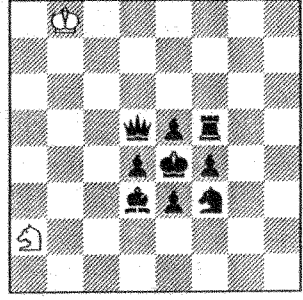
